

## The Guardian Group

### A HANDS-ON SOCIAL JUSTICE PROJECT

The Guardian Group is a Social Justice initiative of the First Unitarian Universalist Society of San Francisco. The Guardian Group provides immediate, hands-on help to newly-arrived LGBT refugees, asylum seekers, and asylees.

The Guardians are people refugees can rely on to give independent advice and to provide unconditional friendship.

The Guardians often hear of needs that are not met by any governmental service and devise ways to obtain what is needed for the refugee. With other members of the Group, Guardians determine what can be funded by donations or what alternatives can be developed.

## Why Guardians for LGBT People?

Heterosexual refugees who come to the United States typically have supportive family from their countries of origin. They can live with these families in low-cost areas of the United States.

LGBT refugees generally cannot live with others from their countries because prejudice against sexual minorities is strong, even among fellow refugees. In addition, these refugees need to live in metropolitan areas such as San Francisco where homophobia is not the cultural norm.

Guardians provide the personal and financial support that heterosexual refugees often receive from their families.

### Terms we Use

**Refugee**— A person who flees their homeland to a third country. The UN determines whether or not they qualify to be classified as a “refugee”. They wait for the US to grant them entry. As soon as they arrive in the US they are able to work and are on path to citizenship.

**Asylum Seeker** — A person who arrives in US on a tourist, business, student, etc. visa. *or arrives without documentation.* Within a year of entering the US, they make a case to the Department of Homeland Security that they are unable to return home due to fear of persecution. They cannot work for six months. Health care is available only if they are a San Francisco resident. They may wait years for their case to be adjudicated.

**Asylee** — An asylum seeker who has been granted asylum.
